Councilman Schoneboom moved to donate \$450 to Wreaths Across America. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith. Motion passed 4-0.

Benton Day Support

Councilman Swift moved to issue the Benton Festival Committee, a check payable to the Community Action Team, in the amount of \$2152.20, equal to the remaining balance from donations collected and expenses from 2021 currently held in the City of Benton General Fund. The motion was seconded by Councilman Ghormley. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Swift moved to approve a \$2000 donation to the Benton Festival Committee for the Benton Festival and other applicable events for 2022. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith. Motion passed 4-0.
